Report on WEKA's Annual Conference

The day-long WEKA conference was held June 9, 2010, at MusicSources in Berkeley, CA. Local conference organizers were Elaine Thornburgh and Sheli Nan. Special thanks goes to Anne Peterson, who helped at the door.

The day began with a productive Board meeting. The Board is energetically reshaping WEKA. WEKA has three new Board members: Stephen Beckham from Tulalip, WA; Kevin Fryer from San Francisco, CA; and Michelle Futornick from Redwood City, CA. The resignation of Sheli Nan was accepted with thanks for her work on behalf of WEKA. Aside from some wonderful camaraderie that day, there were three widely different sessions.

In the morning, Jillon Stoppels Dupree, harpsichord performer extraordinaire and superb teacher, expounded on "The Harpsichordist's Touch: A

> Historical and Contemporary Perspective." Touch, she explained, is the technique to produce different dynamics, tone qualities and colors thus gaining expressivity and musicality on the harpsichord. Ms. Dupree gave numerous original sources and conclusions from them: as little

motion as possible with the hands; fingers close to the keys, naturally rounded, either stroking or depressing the keys (not striking); and arm position straight. In the 20th century, Ms. Dupree noted, there has been an evolution in harpsichord building and touch, which has taken us from Landowska on the Pleyel to what today is referred to as historically informed

instrument building and performance practice. Ms. Dupree explained that one must adjust touch to what is wanted from the instrument. Several useful exercises she suggested are playing with no sound, practicing with slow and fast plucks, "peeling" hands off chords, and varying articulations from short to over-held. Two excellent student volunteers were coached, giving Ms. Dupree the opportunity to demonstrate different aspects of touch.

The two engaging afternoon sessions were led by MusicSources' Artistic Director Gilbert Martinez, who

discussed and performed his harpsichord transcriptions of

several J. S. Bach unaccompanied violin works; and Professor Lorna Peters, who presented her *Camerata Capistano* from California State University, Sacramento.

Mr. Martinez gave a most scholarly presentation. He mentioned existing transcriptions by Bach, which provide clues to the method Bach himself used. A quote from Mr. Martinez's handout follows: "My present transcriptions are based on my mining clues within the keyboard works of J.S. Bach and compositional techniques as they would have been known in his own time." In his transcriptions, Mr. Martinez does not regard the violin part as a "right-hand part" needing accompaniment. Rather he looks at the work contrapuntally, taking it to its "logical end." Mr. Martinez's performance of his



transcriptions was positively virtuosic.

Camerata Capistano (above) is an historically informed (primarily student) Baroque ensemble now in its fifth year. It was wonderful to see students so passionately engaged in the ensemble and performing diverse repertoire so well! Professor Peters obviously is an excellent and inspiring coach, and we expect her students to be performers and teachers one day.
