Directions to Saint Mark's Cathedral

Travel by Car

From eastbound I-90, take I-5 North.

From Northbound I-5: Take the Olive Way exit off of I-5 (the Olive Way exit reopened in May 2010). The ramp will take you to the right. Proceed up to the top of the hill to Broadway. Take a left on Broadway. Go through the shopping district. After the shopping district, Broadway becomes 10th Ave East. Continue on 10th Ave as it enters the residential district. The entrance to the Cathedral parking lot is on the left at the second light after you enter the residential district.

From Southbound I-5, take the Boylston Street exit #168A. At stoplight, turn left onto E. Roanoke Street and stay in the right hand lane. Go to the 2nd stoplight (just past the fire station) and turn right onto 10th Ave E. Go to the top of the hill. The Cathedral is on the right. The entrance is at E. Galer. There is a pedestrian stop light at this intersection.

From the 520 bridge, take the Roanoke/Harvard Exit. Turn right at the stoplight on to E. Roanoke Street. Go to the next stoplight (just past the fire station) and turn right onto 10th Ave E. Go to the top of the hill. The Cathedral is on the right. The entrance is at E. Galer Street. There is a pedestrian stop light at this intersection.

Travel by Bus

Saint Mark's is easily accessed from downtown by Metro Bus #49 or visit the King County Metro website to plan your trip to Saint Mark's.

Parking at St. Mark's Episcopal Cathedral

Drivers can pull into the main Cathedral entrance, drive in front of the Cathedral, and park in the lot on the south side of the building. Enter the front main (east) doors of the Cathedral. Parking is FREE.

Other Directions to St. Mark's from within Seattle

Southbound from the University District (U-District): Go south on Roosevelt Way NE over the University Bridge. Turn left on Harvard Ave E and go all the way up the hill. Then turn left on E. Roanoke, followed by a right at the next light on 10th Ave East. Go approximately one mile, and the Cathedral will be on your right.

Northbound from Capitol Hill: Go north on Broadway. Broadway terminates at the end of the business district at Roy Street, so veer right at the light onto 10th Avenue East. Go four blocks, and the Cathedral will be on your left.

Directions to Trinity Parish Church

Trinity Parish Church is located at 609 Eighth Avenue, on the corner of Eighth Avenue and James Street in Seattle's First Hill neighborhood.

Travel by Car

Going north on I-5

Take exit 164A towards Spokane/Madison Street. Follow the indications to James Street. Turn right onto James Street and left onto 8th Avenue.

Going south on I-5

Take the James Street exit 165A. From 6th Avenue turn left onto James Street, continuing up the hill, then turn left again onto 8th Avenue.

Travel by Bus

Trinity Parish is accessible by Metro bus. Go to Metro's trip planner page at www.metrokc.gov.

Parking at Trinity Episcopal Church

WEKA conference participants, attendees and Board members can park all day on Saturday in either the Trinity Episcopal Church garage or the Church parking lot.

Parking Garage: The garage is part of the new Skyline retirement community. The garage entry is on the north side of the building on Columbia St. If the gate is not open, drivers should take a ticket, and the Church will validate it later. (Parking is FREE).

Parking Lot: This is on 7th Avenue, between Columbia and Marion. The signs that give directions to parking say "Trinity Parish Parking." If there is no attendant, put a note on the dashboard: Trinity Episcopal Church. Parking is FREE.
